Erie/Monroe/St. Joseph Corridor proposed traffic control change

Back Ground

The City of South Haven hired Progressive AE to complete a traffic review and analyses of the section of Erie Street from Monroe Boulevard to St. Joseph Street.

Recommendations

Based upon the information at hand the following changes should be made in order provide a more consistent, more efficient, and therefore slightly safer set of control devices at these two intersections. Those recommendations are as follows:

At Erie/Monroe

Initial adjustments:

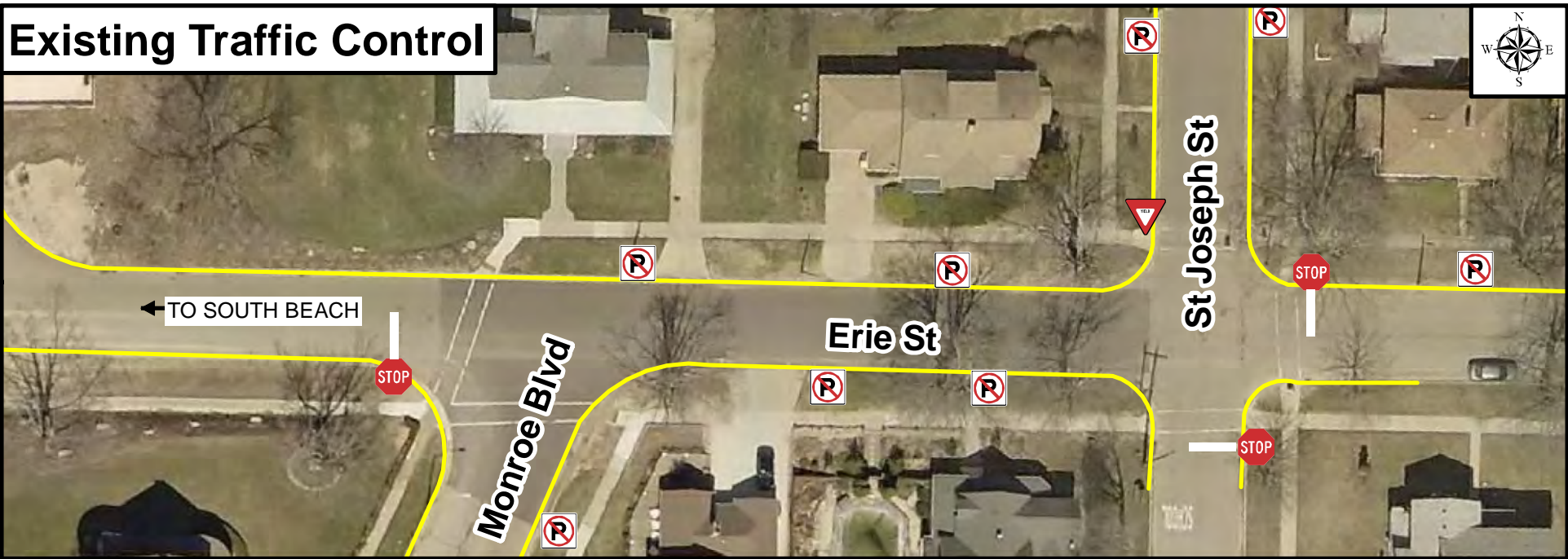
- Remove the current stop sign and stop bar on the eastbound Erie approach
- Place a stop sign and applicable stop bar on the northbound Monroe approach (with temporary sign flagging/other to enhance driver recognition)

At Erie/St. Joseph

- Remove stop sign and stop bar on westbound Erie approach
- Replace the existing yield sign on southbound St. Joseph with a stop sign (with temporary sign flagging/other to enhance driver recognition) and add a stop bar
